Bids received after the deadline for submission of bids as stated herein shall not be considered and shall be returned to the late bidder unopened.

<u>Time and Place Sealed Proposals Will be Opened and Considered.</u> Sealed proposals will be opened and bids tabulated April 28, 2023 at 11:00 a.m. in the Board Room, Conference Center, 2nd Floor, Des Moines International Airport, 5800 Fleur, Drive, Des Moines, Iowa, 50321, for consideration by the Des Moines Airport Authority Board (Board) at its meeting on at 9:00 a.m. on May 9, 2023. The Board may award a Contract at said meeting, or at such other time and place as shall then be announced.

General Nature of Public Improvement

Construct Terminal Deicing Apron - Bid Package #1

Contract#: 2023-02-20

Installation of a new spent deicing fluid (glycol) storage tank including diversion structure and controls for the tank, installation of underground stormwater detention, trenchless installation of 36 inch storm sewer and 6 inch subdrain in casing pipe under taxiway pavement, 36 inch and 42 inch trenched storm sewer installation, approximately 1,950 LF of airfield electric circuit home run duct bank relocation and DSM communication conduits relocation, including approximately 600 LF of trenchless airfield duct bank relocation and communication duct bank relocation in casing pipe under taxiway pavement, and relocation of the primary wind cone. A bid alternate for the project is the reconstruction of 3,050 SY of Taxiway P mainline pavement between Taxiway D and Runway 13/31.

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The improvement is divided into two separate Divisions of work. Division 1 construction shall occur between August 30, 2023 and November 15, 2023, and

consists of all items included in Phase 1 and Phase 2 construction. Phase 1 work consists of the installation of the casing pipes with conduits for the airfield electric circuit home run duct bank and communication conduits under the intersection of Taxiway D and Taxiway P. Phase 2 work consists of installation of casing pipes with storm sewer and subdrain under the Taxiway P and Taxiway H intersection, and storm sewer installation in the infield area SE of Taxiway H.

Division 2 construction is for all Phase 3 and Phase 4 construction items that will occur in 2024. Division 2 work is contingent on the receipt of federal funds by the Authority. Division 2 work may therefore be removed from the contract. The Authority will make a decision regarding whether to proceed with Division 2 work on or before August 25, 2023.

The Engineer's opinion of probable construction cost for the Work is \$11,900,000 to \$12,700,000 (including Bid Alternate).

<u>Commencement of Work.</u> Work on the Division 1 improvements shall be commenced any time after a written Notice to Proceed for Division 1 work only is issued and shall be completed as stated herein. Notice to proceed is contingent upon Submittal and Acceptance of the Contractor's Safety Plan Compliance Document, and submittal of all required insurance certifications.

Notice to Proceed for Division 2 work is contingent upon the Owner receiving Federal funding assistance under the Airport Improvement Program. The Authority will make a decision regarding whether to proceed with Division 2 work on or before August 25, 2023. Division 2 work shall not commence until receipt of a Notice to Proceed for the Division 2 work.

Bid Security and Bonds. Each Bidder shall accompany its bid with bid security as defined in Iowa Code Section 26.8, as security that the successful Bidder will enter into a Contract for the work bid upon and will furnish after the award of Contract corporate Surety Performance and Payment Bond(s), in a form acceptable to the Board, for the faithful performance of the Contract, in an amount equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the amount of the Contract. The Bidder's security shall be in the amount of five (5%) percent of the Bid and shall be in the form of a cashier's check or a certified check drawn on an FDIC insured bank in Iowa or on an FDIC insured bank chartered under the laws of the United States; or a certified share draft drawn on a credit union in Iowa or chartered under the laws of the United States; or a Bid Bond on the form provided in the Contract Documents with corporate Surety satisfactory to the Board. The bid shall contain no condition except as provided in the specifications.

<u>Performance, Payment, and Maintenance Bonds.</u> Each successful Bidder will be required to furnish corporate Surety Bonds in an amount equal to one hundred percent (100%) of its Contract price. Said Bonds shall be issued by a responsible Surety approved by the Des Moines Airport Authority and shall guarantee the faithful performance of the Contract and the terms and conditions therein contained and shall guarantee the prompt

payment of all material and labor, and protect and save harmless the Des Moines Airport Authority from claims and damages of any kind caused by the operations of the Contract and shall also guarantee the maintenance of the improvement caused by failures in materials and construction for a period of one (1) year from and after acceptance of the Contract.

<u>Award of Contract.</u> All proposals submitted in accordance with the instructions presented herein will be subject to evaluation. Bids may be held by the Des Moines Airport Authority for a period not to exceed 30 days from the date of the bid opening for the purpose of conducting the bid evaluation.

The contract award shall include both Division 1 and Division 2 work. However, Division 2 construction is contingent upon the Owner receiving Federal funding assistance under the Airport Improvement Program. If the Owner does not receive Federal funding assistance required for the Division 2 work, value of the Division 2 work, as shown by the bidder's proposal, will be subtracted from the Contract Price at no penalty to the Owner. No additional price adjustments shall be allowed. The Authority will make a decision regarding whether to proceed with Division 2 work on or before August 25, 2023.

The Owner will base the award of contract upon the lowest aggregate sum proposal submitted (Division 1 construction plus Division 2 construction) from those bidders the Owner confirms as being responsive and responsible. The right is reserved, as the Des Moines Airport Authority may require, to reject any and all bids and to waive any informality in the bids received.

<u>Contract Documents.</u> A copy of said plans, specifications, and form of contract, and estimated total cost is now on file in the office of the Director of Engineering and Planning and may be examined at the Des Moines International Airport, 2nd Floor, Room 207, 5800 Fleur, Drive, Des Moines, Iowa.

The Contractor is required to comply with wage and labor provisions and to pay minimum wages in accordance with the current schedule of wage rates established by the United States Department of Labor.

The contractor shall carry out applicable requirements of 49 CFR Part 26 in the award and administration of this DOT-assisted contracts. In accordance with 49 CFR Part 26.45, the sponsor has established a contract goal of <u>6.89%</u> percent participation for small business concerns owned and controlled by certified socially and economically disadvantaged enterprise (DBE). The bidder shall make and document good faith efforts, as defined in Appendix A of 49 CFR Part 26, to meet this established goal.

These goals are applicable to all of the contractor's construction work (whether or not it is Federal or federally-assisted) performed in the covered area. If the contractor performs construction work in a geographical area located outside of the covered area, it shall apply the goals established for such geographical area where the work is actually performed. <u>Completion of Work.</u> The project shall occur during the 2023 and 2024 construction seasons. The Work is divided between Division 1 and Division 2.

Division 1

Includes Phase 1 and Phase 2 Work. Phase 1 consists of the installation of the casing pipes and conduits for the airfield electric circuit home run duct bank relocation and DSM communication conduits relocation. Phase 1 construction may start on or after August 30, 2023, but may not begin prior to August 30, 2023. Phase 1 construction must be completed by October 2, 2023.

Phase 2 work is the installation of the 36 inch storm sewer in the 54 inch casing pipe with 36 inch storm sewer, and the 6 inch subdrain in 12 inch casing pipe under the Taxiway P and Taxiway H intersection. Phase 2 also consists of approximately 260 LF of 36 inch storm sewer installation SW of the Taxiway P and

Taxiway H intersection. Phase 2 may occur concurrently with Phase 1, and must be complete by November 15, 2023.

Division 2 (contingent on federal funding)

Includes Phase 3 and Phase 4 Work. Phase 3 is for the installation of the spent deicing fluid (glycol) storage tank and associated diversion structures and controls, the underground stormwater detention, storm sewer pipe installation adjacent to the stormwater detention and glycol storage tank, the installation of the relocated airfield electric circuit home run duct bank and communications duct bank on the NW side of Taxiway P between Taxiway D and Taxiway B, relocating the remote processing unit (RPU), and relocating the primary wind cone. Phase 3 has an early start date of April 8, 2024, and must be completed prior to starting Phase 4 Work.

Phase 4 is for the installation of the relocated airfield electric circuit home run duct bank and communications duct bank on the SW side of Taxiway D between Taxiway P and existing electric and communications manholes SE of Taxiway D2. Phase 4 also includes relaying airfield circuit home run cables and pavement sensor cables in the relocated electric duct banks and communication conduits installed in Phase 1, Phase 3, and Phase 4. The reconstruction of the Taxiway P mainline pavement between Taxiway D and Runway 13/31 is also included in Phase 4 (if this Bid Alternate is executed). Phase 4 may not begin until Phase 3 is completed. Phase 4 construction must be complete by September 13, 2024.
