



RECOGNIZE AND REPORT HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Human trafficking involves the use of force, fraud, or coercion to obtain some type of labor or commercial sex act.

Any minor (under the age of 18) engaged in commercial sex is a victim of human trafficking according to federal law, regardless of whether there is force, fraud, or coercion.

INDICATORS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING

If you observe the following indicators of suspected human trafficking activity, you should report them right away.



No control of travel identification/documents



No freedom of movement/social interaction



Difficulty articulating reasonable/logical travel plans



A non-genuine relationship; particularly parent/guardian-child

On the Ground

In-Flight

By following your **airline reporting protocol**

Flight-deck communications: Aircraft communications addressing and reporting system or domestic event network
